

FULBRIGHT SCHOLAR PROGRAM ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Advisory Committee Charter

The Fulbright Scholar Program Advisory Committee is authorized by the Office of International Affairs and will serve at the pleasure of the governing body. It shall be composed of faculty representing different colleges and departments.

Purpose

The purpose of the Fulbright Scholar Program Advisory Committee is to advise, assist, support and advocate for Fulbright programs on the Ohio State campus on matters that will strengthen opportunities for faculty, staff and students. The Committee's responsibilities include:

- Support and advocate for the Fulbright program to raise its profile and visibility.
- Assist the program in setting priorities, including participating in ongoing planning activities.
- Facilitate cooperation and communication between the program and the campus community.
- Offer recommendations for program improvement.

Committee Charge

- To offer recommendations for the Fulbright Scholar Program and to provide information relevant to Ohio State policy about the Fulbright program to the administration, faculty and professional staff.
- To confer with and assist the Office of International Affairs in the formulation of the Fulbright program agenda, policies, procedures and activities.

Membership

Inaugural committee members shall be selected and appointed by the Fulbright Scholar program administrator. Subsequent committee members will be nominated for appointment by both the administrator and the current advisory committee. The committee will be composed of faculty members whose creativity, imagination, commitment and integrity are the basis for their appointment to serve. Each member of the committee will be dedicated to the promotion and enhancement of the Fulbright program and to achieving the objectives of the university plan. Each faculty member will serve a term of three (3) years, with one third of the committee changing every year.

Functions

The committee serves as a communications network and provides advice for existing or potential cross-university initiatives and activities. Its functions may include:

- To propose a theme for and to plan an annual International Affairs Symposium.
- To promote rewards for international research, teaching and engagement, recommend nominees and judge applications for university international awards.

Meetings

The committee meetings will be held once a semester during the academic year (August to May) and as needed when working in sub-committees. Note taking will be provided by the Office of International Affairs in order to facilitate communication with the membership and the university community.
